



TGSE Dress Code & Appearance

TGSE students must wear suitable traditional golfing attire at all times during practice and play. Students incorrectly attired will not be able to participate in school activities until they are correctly attired.

Correct Attire	Incorrect Attire (Not exhaustive)
Collared Shirt	Jeans
TGSE branded shirt during tournaments	Collarless shirt
Trousers (correctly fitted)	Beach shorts
Tailored shorts	Gym wear
Golf shoes	Clothing with excessive pictures, writing or pockets, sports shirts with excessive branding or logos, football/ rugby shirts or the like.
Sleeveless or long sleeved top	Hoodies
Waterproof suit	Tracksuit Pants
Dress shoes (Lectures)	Tekkies / Training Shoes

Students are expected to represent TGSE with a smart professional appearance when wearing TGSE branded clothing for official activities such as tournaments, team matches and on work experience duty. Students failing to wear the correct TGSE branded clothing for tournament play will be disqualified for the tournament at hand and be ineligible for Order of Merit points.

During the course of exams, students are permitted to wear casual clothing to write their exams. Should they wish to practice as well they are required to change into the above mentioned golfing attire

Other points regarding appearance include, but are not limited to:

- Clothes are to be neatly presented.
- Clothes are to be of the correct size and fitting.
- Shirts are to be tucked in at all times.
- Sleeves are not to be rolled up to the shoulders.
- Body piercing and accompanying jewellery are to be removed from sight.
- Tattoos (whether temporary or permanent) or any other body art are to remain covered up out of sight.

Additional branding is not permitted on TGSE branded clothing without the express prior permission of TGSE. Such permission is not guaranteed and will be viewed on a case by case basis.

Please note that Royal Johannesburg & Kensington GC has its own specific dress regulations that need to be adhered to while playing the course. For example caps, when worn, must have peaks facing forward. Students are advised to acquaint themselves with these club rules to avoid problems.
